

South Carolina Healthy Brain Research Network Doctoral Scholars Program

Recent estimates show that 5.2 million Americans have Alzheimer's disease. The Institute of Medicine predicts that the future workforce "will be woefully inadequate in its capacity to meet the large demand for health services for older adults if current patterns of care and of the training of providers continue."

The **South Carolina Healthy Brain Research Network (SC-HBRN)** is recruiting doctoral students for a new scholars program!

A two-year commitment is required. 20 hour per week and 10 hour per week positions will be available for students. The overall goal of the scholars program is to prepare doctoral students for leadership in cognitive health and aging research, research translation, and dissemination.

Scholars will have the opportunity to engage in state and national research, manuscript development, and presentations. Scholars will also be required to work with at least one partner per year (e.g., Alzheimer's Association, AARP, USC Office for the Study of Aging). Scholars will be strongly encouraged to complete the USC Certificate of Graduate Study in Gerontology or the USC Certificate of Graduate Study in Health Communication.
